PE Orienteering



Since returning to school after Easter students have been participating in orienteering during their PE lessons, as pictured above. The PE department received some funding from Sport England a couple of years ago and have been able to map out the school site.

Orienteering is an exciting outdoor adventure sport that exercises body and mind. The aim is to navigate between checkpoints or controls marked on a special orienteering map. In competitive orienteering, the challenge is to complete the course in the quickest time. Students have been focusing on pacing, orienting their map and panning their route in the most time effective way.

During lessons, students have been challenged to develop important key skills, such as team work, co-operation, communication, leadership and problem solving. The activity is also excellent preparation for those opting for the Duke of Edinburgh's Award in Year 9. The activity has been such a success that the department has decided to start a new club after school starting next Tuesday. We look forward to working with students that want to further develop what they have learnt in lessons and also learn some new navigating skills, such as map work and testing their skills in a more competitive environment.


