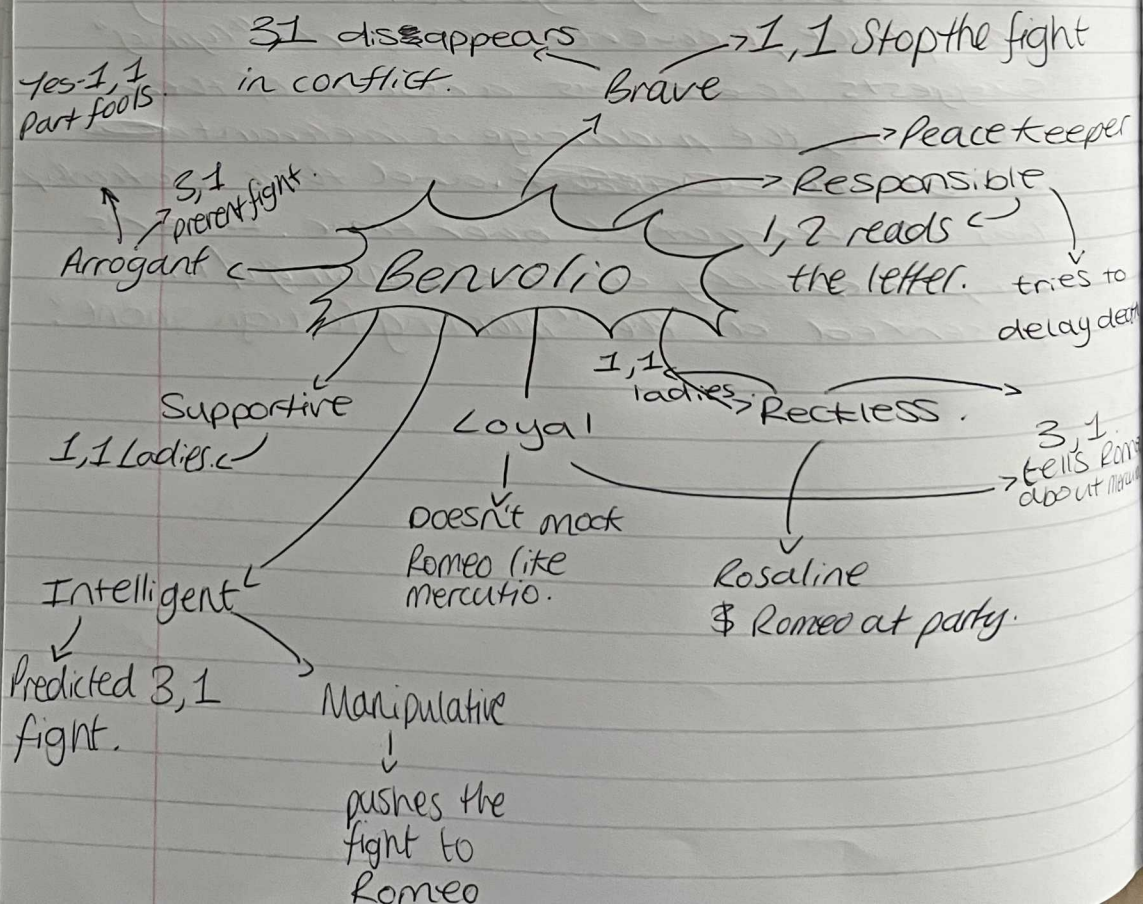

- 5-1 E) "I defy you st as."

At first glance, it seems that Juliet is blaming Romeo as he compares him to a "raven", yet on closer analysis, Romeo is "dove feathered" sowing Juliet's love Romeo as she continues to make excuses and exceptions for him.



Benvolio's name symbolises "good will" and his first action is an attempt to stop the brawl.

"Part, fools! // Put up your swords. You know not what you do".

Creates a Biblical illusion

"Forgive them father, for they do not know what they do." (Luke 23:34)

Placatory - Intended to make someone less angry or hostile.

1,1 - Still uses sword whilst attempting to stop conflict.

1,2 - encourages Romeo to attend the ball

1,4 - On the way to the ball with Romeo & Mercutio

2,1 - Listens to Mercutio mocking Romeo.

2,4 - Joins in with mocking the Nurse.

3,1 - Tells Romeo that Mercutio died after watching him get stabbed. Maybe influences Romeo ~~to~~ to kill Tybalt.
